About Merit

MERIT SCHOOL OF MUSIC is a nationally-respected music school located in Chicago's Near West Side. For 38 years, it's been home to a diverse community of talented young musicians and a springboard for personal transformations. Known for providing access to high-quality music education, Merit serves over 4,000 students on site and off.

Merit offers a continuum of programs, including early childhood classes, instrumental music and voice instruction and private lessons. Training takes place at Merit's Joy Faith Knapp Music Center and within local schools through the unique *Bridges: Partners in Music* program. Offered at 30 sites across Chicagoland, *Bridges* allows students to gain instruction with Merit's experienced, professional educators—all within the convenience of their own school setting.

More advanced student musicians can audition for the highest-level program, Merit's Alice S. Pfaelzer Tuition-free Conservatory. Conservatory students are among the elite young musicians in the city and represent an economically and ethnically diverse cross section of the Chicago area. Students are only accepted by audition and receive college preparatory level training tuition free. Nearly 100% of the conservatory's graduating seniors are accepted into college, and most continue their music studies at top colleges, universities and music conservatories.

Merit is devoted to giving students—especially those living in economically disadvantaged communities—the opportunity to grow through music. It provides financial support through program subsidies, need-based tuition relief, low-cost instrument rental, and music supplies so that motivated students can participate in every program regardless of economic circumstance. More than half of Merit's budget is allocated to financial aid and scholarships, with 75% of its students receiving assistance. The school is committed to musical excellence, giving youth the tools to grow, develop personal talents and discover success; no matter what path they take in life.

In 1984, Merit responded to requests from Chicago Public Schools to create an in-school music education program, resulting in the formation of *Bridges: Partners in Music*. Today, the *Bridges* program serves more than 2,000 students each year, bringing the highest caliber music instruction to dozens of public and private schools, and community centers throughout Chicago and Northwest Indiana. Merit teaching artists work within these sites to offer group instruction in strings, band, choir, piano, guitar, early childhood, and general music.

Merit employs a faculty of passionate and highly-skilled music educators committed to helping young people succeed in reaching their full musical and personal potential. Faculty members hold advanced degrees, many from major conservatories and music schools from around the world.

In many cases, *Bridges: Partners in Music* serves as the first step for students in Merit's comprehensive continuum of instruction. Motivated students are encouraged to continue their studies at Merit's Joy Faith Knapp Music Center by enrolling in private lessons, the Instrumental Music Program or by successfully auditioning into the Alice S. Pfaelzer Tuition-free Conservatory. Merit School of Music opens these doors for students by providing over \$2.5 million in support each year, often through generous need-based scholarships. Making Music in These Neighborhoods



Course Offerings

BAND

Grades 4 - 12

2 - 5 days per week | 45-60 minutes

Introduce young musicians to their choice of brass, woodwind, or percussion instruments. One class can accommodate 25-60 students depending on age and level of instruction. For more comprehensive programming, schools can also offer sectional classes which focus on a specific instrument family.

CHOIR

Grades 1 - 12

1 - 5 days per week | 45-60 minutes

Teach students to use their voice as an instrument. One class can accommodate 20-50 students depending on age and level of instruction. Choir classes must have a working piano or keyboard and ideally, an accompanist for each rehearsal.

GENERAL MUSIC

Grades K - 5

1 day per week | 40-60 minutes

Give students a musical foundation and head start in learning an instrument. One class can accommodate up to 30 students, however an adult assistant for classroom management is encouraged. Global percussion can be offered as an add-on program for grades 3-5.

STRING

Grades K - 12

2 - 3 days per week | 45-60 minutes

Introduce young musicians to their choice of string instruments. Each class must be dedicated to one stringed instrument: violin, viola, cello, or bass. One string class can accommodate 6-10 students, and classrooms must include a music stand for each student. Schools can also add orchestra programming for students completing at least one year of strings. One orchestra class can accommodate 25-60 students depending on age and level of instruction. Orchestra space must include one music stand for every two students and provide room for the conductor/teacher, ideally with a podium.

PIANO

Grades K - 5

1 - 2 days per week | 45-60 minutes

Give students the opportunity to learn piano and gain a strong foundation in music theory and performance. Group piano classes serve between six to eight students each and require the use of weighted keyboards and headsets. This is a great way to introduce students to the instrument in an engaging, collaborative setting.

GIIITAR

Grades 4 - 12

2 - 3 days per week | 45-60 minutes

Provide guitar instruction to students and provide a foundation in performance and related theory. Guitar students learn best in small groups. One class accommodates 6-10 students depending on age and level of instruction. All students must have a foot stand, and classrooms need chairs and music stands for each student.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Grades Pre-K - 1

1 day per week | 45-60 minutes

Stimulate young minds with their first musical experience. One class can accommodate 15 students or as many as 30 students with an adult assistant. An open classroom space with carpet provides an ideal setting for dancing/movement, sitting on the floor and setting out instruments.

General Music Residencies

Merit is excited to offer general music residencies this year. In these residencies Merit teaching artists collaborate with students and classroom teachers to creatively enhance reading, language and critical thinking skills through music.

Merit offers the following units for third and fourth grade:

MUSIC AND STORYTELLING

3rd Grade | 8 weeks

An integrated curriculum utilizing a variety of learning experiences. Classroom teachers work with Merit teaching artists to select a story and topic to bring to life through music and performance. The curriculum is tailored around one of three stories:

- an Ashanti Tale (about cooperation, hardwork and laziness)
- a Nigerian folktale (an anti-bullying message)
- a West African Pourquoi Tale (about cause and effect relationships and taking responsibility)

RECORDERS RULE!

3rd and/or 4th Grade) | 16 or 32 weeks

Students learn the foundations of music performance and music theory through the recorder. This curriculum consists of singing games, dancing and songs from American cultures and world music.

SONGWRITING

3rd and/or 4th Grade | 8 weeks

Students will learn effective strategies for problem solving and creating songs in a cooperative environment. Together students create album covers, write an artist biography and learn to create music. This residency might conclude with a final performance or presentation for other classrooms.

Students may join the continuum at any point, or begin their study at Merit and proceed to the highest level of achievement, the Alice S. Pfaelzer Tuition-free Conservatory—all within Merit's supportive community of music educators. Classes are scheduled after school, on Saturdays, and over the summer.
