Description

Merit School of Music seeks tuba/euphonium Instructors to join its substitute faculty list, who could teach group classes and private lessons in Merit's on-site programs as well as within the *Merit Music in Communities*, in-schools partnership program. Students may range in age from fourth grade through high school, and ability levels vary from beginner through advanced.

Merit develops musicians and provides young people with the tools they need to excel in life, with virtually 100 percent of our graduates going on to conservatory or college.

Simultaneously, Merit is continually working towards becoming an organization that is truly reflective of the demographics of the city and the students we serve. Job Responsibilities

Responsibilities of **Substitute Tuba/Euphonium Instructors** include, but are not limited to:

- Other projects as assigned

- Proven success teaching tuba/euphonium students at various skill levels from beginner through advanced
- Strong classroom management skills
- Ability to collaborate and work well with colleagues and administrators
- Flexible and adaptive disposition
- Consistent and reliable with a high level of follow through
- A high level of personal musicianship

Bachelor's degree in music or equivalent experience/training

Schedule

Teaching opportunities present themselves on an as-needed basis and will be communicated through Merit faculty or administration. Most Monday through Friday programming occurs between 12pm and 7pm. Saturday programming occurs between 9am and 5pm.

**Please note that instruction is currently scheduled to take place in-person at Merit's Joy Faith Knapp Music Center or in-person at MMiC partner sites – this position requires candidates to live in the Chicago area.*

COVID-19 Precautions

Merit School of Music requires all employees to provide proof of vaccination against COVID-19. Please plan accordingly. As mandated by the Governor of Illinois, face masks are required to enter the school. Merit invested heavily in its HVAC system to improve ventilation throughout the building. Work that can be done remotely will continue to occur virtually to limit traffic within the building and prioritize the safety of in-person instruction.

Compensation and Application

Group classes at Merit's main campus in the West Loop are paid at \$49/hour. Group classes off-site at MMiC programs are \$50/hour, with mileage reimbursed as a roundtrip from Merit's campus. Private lessons rates are \$44/hour.
